Ana : You're joking !

Kalinda : I just loved it ! Your mom's so cool ! Do you remember ? She allowed us to have pizza in your bedroom. My mom just freaks out if I eat anything in my bedroom. We really had a great time! And your house is so , you know, er, lively ...

Ana : Er, lively is the word!Jonathan, can't you see I'm on the phone ?! Oh, I can't bear it anymore ! Kalinda, ready for a swap ?

CONCLUSION :

Pour exprimer un **SOUHAIT** ou un **REGRET**, on peut utiliser l'expression

ou

Ces expressions sont souvent suivies d'un verbe au **PRETERIT**.

C'est pour cela que *can* devient : dans ce cas la personne émet un regret que l'action ne puisse se faire.

If only I had a dog. Si seulement j'avais un chien (mais je n'en ai pas).

If only I could have a dog. Si seulement je pouvais avoir un chien (mais ce n'est pas possible).

I wish I had a dog ! (j'aimerais bien avoir un chien)

Lorsque l'on émet un souhait ou un regret avec le verbe *be*, on utilise **WERE** à toutes les personnes lorsque la situation est **inimaginable** et **non réalisable**.

If only he were famous ! I wish I were a dolphin !

LE SOUHAIT / LE REGRET: Exercices:

Ex.1 : Transforme les phrases en commençant par « I wish »

I would like to have a horse.

I would like to play soccer, but I can't.

I would like to be less shy.

It's a pity (= c'est dommage) it's cold.

I wanted my uncle to come with us.

Ex.2: Reformule les phrases en commençant par "if only »

I'm not tall.

My father doesn't have a big car.

I would like to see you tomorrow.

I can't repair my bike (I don't have the tools).

CORRECTION:

Ex.1:

I wish I had a horse.

I wish I could play soccer.

I wish I were less shy.

I wish it were less cold / I wish it were warmer.

I wish my uncle came with us.

Ex.2:

If only I were taller.

If only my father had a big car.

If only I could see you tomorrow.

If only I could repair my bike.
